SEPU UNVEILS JUNIOR SCHOOL SCIENCE KIT FOR GRADE 7,8,9



It was pomp, bomb and color as School Equipment Production Unit unveiled Junior School Science kit for grades 7,8 and 9 during the 2024 KEPSHA annual AGM and conference at Sheikh Khalifa children Welfare Centre in Mombasa on November 5, 2024.

The kit will enhance teaching and learning of Integrated science, Pretechnical studies, Health and Agriculture in Junior school curriculum offering a timely solution to CBC which puts emphasis on experiential learning.

Some of the dignitaries who witnessed the launch included the Chief of Staff and Head of Public Service in the Executive Office of the President, Felix K. Koskei, the Principal Secretary, Basic Education, Ministry of Education, Dr. Richard Belio Kipsang, the Secretary General of Kenya National Union of Teachers, Mr. Collins Oyuu, KEPSHA National Chairman, Mr. Johnson Nzioka among others.

SEPU CEO, Dr. Joel Mabonga sensitised the more than 12,000 heads of Institutions in attendance about SEPU, the products and services the Unit offers before presiding the show stopping launch.

The kit launched will give SEPU a life line through it's uptake as the government rolls out grade 9 class in 2025, a key transition to Kenyan learners in the CBC curriculum.

At the first cock craw on a Friday morning while other students headed to school, Opere grabbed his brown short and a tainted white shirt, and two fishing rods with rings and hooks attached to each, walked about 10 yards and was at the lake shore.

One of the fishing rods he named "dawe" what in Abandu land is referred to as "tawe". The other rod he called "okadogi" loosely translated as "I'm not going back. The rods were new and as skilled fisherman he wanted to be the first to land them on the promising warm waters of the lake and get the first catch before anyone else.

To Opere the names were symbolic. As a science student he swore never to go back to school untill there was a laboratory in in place fully equipped. So Opere sat his body on one of the soft rocks yonder.

He threw the first hook into the water, swirling it gently, he noticed the floater attached to it sink slowly underneath. This only happens when the catch is heavy. He swiftly lifted the rod up and to his amazement an about 5 kg tilapia flapped her tail in protest to the pains of the hook, thanks to his ancestors this was a big catch. As he lifted the second rod, he noticed an engine powered boat approaching the shore.

10 minutes later the boat docked. In it were three men dressed in blue shirts with a logo (SEPU) around the breast pocket. Inside the boat were two wooden boxes with four caster under each. The men enquired of Migingo JSS. Opere declared to them that he was a student at the school but left because the school had no science equipment. As he led them to the school holding rods on one hand and the fish on the other. Mr. Akwabi chukled and revealed that the two wooden boxes were a mobile laboratory and a science kit. Akwabi told the young man that his worries were over and that henceforth learning science was going to be fascinating. Opere's eyes breamed with excitement as he handed the 5kg tilapia to Mr. Akwabi while they headed to school
